Beginning with the April club meeting the Lake Sawyer Hawks will be returning to a monthly get together meeting, the specific dates and times have not yet been determined.

<u>Show and tell</u>—Randy Ling demonstrated his control surface hinging method where each flat pin hinge is wrapped around with a single layer of tissue paper then inserted in pre-cut slots in the wood surface. A single pin spanning the length of the control surface is inserted along the hinge line to establish the alignment of all hinges. Then ca glue is applied to the tissue which wicks around the hinge gluing the hinges in place.
