1. Rod Claus displayed two aircraft, a P-40 Warhawk designed and built by Pat Johnston originally powered by a Saito 56 and a Talon powered by a Super Tigre 56 that was designed and built by Joe Dill. This is a classic series control line airplane with a high-quality finish. Rod is trying to document when it was designed so he can fly it in control line classic aerobatic contests.

- 2. Gabe Hanzeli displayed two aircraft, an RV7 short kit by Lanzo Laser works covered in the color scheme of the national soccer team of his homeland Hungary. And a QB 10 short kit by Lanzo Laser Works covered in Red, White and Blue iron covering.
- 3. Randy Ling displayed an E-flite platinum ARF scale J3 cub.
- 4. Peter McCowin displayed, an Avro Vulcan bomber painted as the bomber would have been seen in 1963 on the flight line of RAF 617 squadron. The Vulcan has a full operational navigation and anti-collision light system including automated wing retractable landing lights. A sequenced operational scale ribbon drag chute can be activated at landing on the 10-wheel scale gear system. A 10 channel Spektrum radio programmed with logic sequences controls the various systems.
- 5. Steve Ashmore Displayed two aircraft, including a Dimond Dust flying wing modified with a EDF propulsion system and a Sig Sky Bolt which Steve scratch built from plans and painted very nicely.
